Ein wenig Landeskunde

When traveling to most countries in Europe, you need to convert dollars (USD) to euros (EUR), since almost all European countries have adopted this new currency. The conversion table (**Umrechnungstabelle**) on the right shows you how many euros you will receive for a certain amount of dollars and vice versa. The rates will vary, and you may want to look up the current rate of exchange in a newspaper or on a web site.

Looking at the clothing ad and using the conversion chart, compare the prices for clothing in Germany to what you pay in the United States. In general, in which country do you think clothes are more expensive? What types of clothes would you expect to be more expensive in Germany than in the United States?

Ich suche eine Bluse.

I'm looking for a blouse.

Definite and indefinite articles, accusative case

Look at the following sentences:

Der Pulli kostet 15 Euro.

Ein Pulli kostet 15 Euro.

Möchten Sie **den Pulli**?

Möchten Sie **einen Pulli**?

What is the difference between the noun phrases **der Pulli/ein Pulli** on the left and the noun phrases **den Pulli/einen Pulli** on the right?

The noun phrases **der Pulli/ein Pulli** on the left are the *subjects* (nominative case) of the sentences. The noun phrases **den Pulli/einen Pulli** on the right are *direct objects* (accusative case) of the sentences. Only articles for masculine nouns change when they are used as direct objects. The articles for feminine, neuter, and plural nouns stay the same.

Neuter	das / ein T-Shirt	das / ein T-Shirt
Plural	die / — Turnschuhe	die / — Turnschuhe

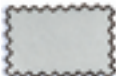
