** REQUIRED SCHOOL SUPPLY: Students must have a 1-inch BINDER with 5 dividers for this class. ** (No, students may not just keep their BINDER papers in a folder.)

Course Description: The purpose of the German I and II classes is to expose students to a variety of the German language in its written and spoken forms as well as the German-speaking countries' cultures and histories so that students who continue studying the language in the future will have a solid base of knowledge to draw on.

A typical week in the German classroom will look like this:

Montag-Dienstag



introduction to new vocab and language feature

Mittwoch




reading outloud or conversation practice

Donnerstag



listening lab with interactive activities

Freitag



quiz on Monday and Tuesday's vocab / lesson

Freitag



culture, history, or travel activity

Grades: Students will be assessed by their performance in 3 categories: Daily Work, Quizzes, Tests

Daily Work = 50% of quarter grade: classroom assignments and BINDER checks Quizzes = 25% Quizzes may only be taken once; no re-takes

Tests = 25% Tests may be re-taken, but the retake score awarded will be no higher than 70% (C-)



Parents can expect that their student's grade will be up-todate in PowerSchool by the end of each weekend. Frau Nutter will send an email to the parents and students when the grades have been completed for the week asking parents and students to double-check that all assignments have been submitted.

Students have one buffer week to turn in any missing work. Missing work not turned in by the following Friday is closed and will no longer be accepted. Each assignment has the same number in both the PowerSchool gradebook and in Schoology, and so parents and students can easily look up missing assignments and their instructions. Each class day's agenda is are also available in Schoology. (Mrs Nutter tells her students that, thanks to Schoology, no one is ever *really* absent from the class.)





CLASSROOM ROUTINES and PROCEDURES for the Students

1. Bring your BINDER with its 5 dividers to class every day. Keep your pages in order. There will be 2 unnanounced BINDER checks each quarter for a grade.

2. ABSENT STUDENTS

- A. Use the Schoology app to read the absent day's agenda.
- B. Get handouts from the "Daily Assignments" BINDER on the right side of the whiteboard ledge. (Handouts can also be printed off from Schoology.)
- C. **Quizzes** that were announced to you prior to your absence **will still be taken a scheduled**. Come to class prepared. Everything you need is on Schoology.
- 3. **AIR PODS / EAR BUDS / HEADPHONES** are not allowed and should *not* be in your ears or around your neck even if you're not listening to anything. Put them in a pocket or bag.
- 4. **PHONES** are not allowed 90% of the time. They should be in your bag until Mrs Nutter asks you to take them out. Notice the "RED No Phone" sign on the whiteboard.

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Disciplinary actions for having phones/headphones out during class:

- a. First offense: official verbal warning recorded on tracking sheet
- b. Second offense: phone or headphones taken for rest of hour; recorded on tracking sheet
- c. Third offense: phone or headphones to sent to main office; recorded on tracking sheet; student goes to office to retrieve item and receives a detention
- 5. **TARDIES:** Be on time. Mrs Nutter marks tardies. T1 = verbal warning; T2 = parent notification; T3 = detention; T4 = double detention; T5 = referral to office/suspension
- 6. **DESKS and OTHER CLASSROOM ITEMS:** Do not write on desks or damage classroom property.
- 7. **FOOD and DRINKS:** No eating in the classroom. Gum is okay, but put it in the trash, not on furniture. Only water may be drunk in the classroom.
