1. Print SEASONAL CLASSIC without a space between the words.	
2. Remove the second and the fourth vowels from the left and replace them with T's. (Write the changed line CLEANLY in this space.)	
3. Insert an M in the fourth position from the right.	
4. Move the third consonant from the left to the first position at the left.	
5. Remove the second vowel from the left and replace it with an I.	
6. Remove the fourth consonant from the left and replace it with a W.	
7. Insert an H in the sixth position from the left and in the eighth position from the right.	
8. Move the first vowel from the right to the position to the right of the third vowel from the left.	
9. Move the sixth consonant from the left to the fourth position from the right.	
10. Insert an R in the eighth position from the right.	
11. Insert a C in the first position at the right.	4
12. Move the sixth consonant from the left to the tenth position from the right.	
13. Move the third vowel from the left to the fourth position from the right.	
14. Wherever two identical consonants appear side by side, remove both letters.
