

ALBERT SCHWEITZER: DOCTOR AND HUMANITARIAN

(1) Dr. Albert Schweitzer (1875-1965) was one of the most altruistic men of all time. (2) He is remembered and respected as an outstanding humanitarian who gave up promising careers in his native Germany to help the people who needed him.

Before he had reached the age of thirty, Dr. Schweitzer was already a well-known philosopher, minister, musician, and writer. (3) His accomplishments in any one of these fields would have gratified most people. (4) Although he could have indulged himself with comfortable living, Dr. Schweitzer decided instead to serve humanity.

(5) After completing medical school, the benign doctor went to Africa in 1913. (6) As a medical missionary, he was ready to put his philanthropic dream into action. (7) In French Equatorial Africa, he became the benefactor of thousands of people who were without medical attention. Operating under primitive conditions, he fought leprosy, sleeping sickness, and other tropical dis-



eases. (8) He used the bountiful donations from his former parishioners, as well as money he had earned from his organ concerts in Germany and France, to finance a modern hospital at Lambaréné. (9) When this benevolent man won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1952, he even contributed his prize of thirty-three thousand dollars to the hospital fund.

(10) Dr. Albert Schweitzer is remembered not only for the benefits he brought to Africans but also as a symbol. Believing that all people deserve respect, he appreciated the preciousness of life and hated violence. His happiness made him feel a duty to help others. In doing so, he became an example to the world of what kindness in thought and action could accomplish.
